The regular meeting of the Council was held August 8. The Council members shared their prayer concerns which included safe travel for Emily Martin, an end to the violence in the Middle East, direction for St. Luke's as they seek an interim pastor and care for those in physical need: Charles Moyer (surgery) Frances Campsey, Thelma Harrahill, Tom Vondra (heart), Mary Vondra (carpal tunnel), Tim & Trudie on the death of Trudie's mother (Ernie Olson friend). Pastor led devotions from Deuteronomy 26:7 which encourages us to know that the Lord hears us and Ephesians 1:9-10 which asks God to make God's will known. We prayed for God's presence and direction for our lives and ministry.

<u>Visions for Ministry</u>: The Council reflected on the meetings held thus far with the councils from Cristo Rey and St. Luke's. The Council then had discussion on the fifth chapter of "Becoming a Blessed Church." It focused on being open to God as Power. The work of the Holy Spirit was discussed.

Reports were received from the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer. Please continue to give generously.

<u>Christian Education</u> reported that Pastor will meet with Amy Serflaten from First Lutheran and explore the combining of our Confirmation program which may include St. Luke's and Cristo Rey, as well. A special word of thanks was expressed for Grace Traynor's leadership for Vacation Bible School. Over thirty students participated throughout the week. David will proceed with Adult Bible Study on an evening in the fall.

<u>Evangelism/Outreach</u> reported on the success of The Kids At Work Program. A special thanks was expressed for Brenda's leadership. A lock-in for youth will be held Friday, September 8-9. Invitations will be sent to First Lutheran, Cristo Rey and St. Luke's youth.

Finance reported on the thank you note from Grace Lutheran, New Orleans.

<u>Property</u> reported that a leak has developed on the tower. A roofing company will be called to examine.

<u>Service/Social Ministry</u> reported that Janet Hula had created a new memorial thank you note. A word of thanks was expressed for her creativity and donation.

Support/Stewardship had no new report.

Worship reported that the ELCA will be releasing a new Hymnal in the fall. It was consensus that we would not explore purchase at this time.

Unfinished Business: Pastor asked if anyone had the desire to pick up work on the NCD emphasis?

New Business: None.



The opening question for review in the fifth chapter of "Becoming a Blessed Church," asks, "To what extent do you sense that your church is truly open to God's power?" This is an intriguing question. I can attempt to answer it in at least three ways.

My first response is to say, "Not much." This seems harsh. Yet, when I look at the signs of whether the Spirit is pervasive in all aspects of Grace Church life, I have to be honest and say, I don't see much of it.

My second response is to say, "More than it used to be." Again, that may seem harsh. Yet, I have to be honest and say, "I see more signs of the work of the Spirit in and among us, today, than I did fifteen years ago."

My third response is to say, "A lot." Now, this feels better. I can point to the work of connecting with the young people and their families through the Kids at Work program. I can point to the work of our efforts to tutor and mentor Sudanese women. I can point to the work of our efforts to tutor Sudanese children. I can point to our Health Ministry efforts to provide hospitality for Latino women and others. These are truly signs, to me, of Grace being open to God's power.

The author says, "God wants our churches to thrive, and to be places of deep love, grace, and the power of the Holy Spirit. God wants our churches to succeed, but for that to happen we have to believe it, be open to it, and depend upon it in faith. A man once said to me: 'God never sets you up to fail.' I've discovered the truth of this promise. When we trust in God and rely on God in faith, believing and acting on that faith no matter what obstacles appear before us, God comes through. Our part is to trust and act on that trust. When we do, God doesn't let us fail."

I am convinced of the truth found in the author's words. I am convinced that God wants us to succeed in being a place where the love of God is shown in word and deed. I know that for this to happen, I must be plugged in to God's Spirit otherwise I can be easily discouraged.

I would like to ask you to do something. I would like you to pray. Pray not just once but daily. Pray that God would open our eyes to the opportunities that God would have us act upon. Pray that God would so fill us with the Spirit that we'd see opportunities and not obstacles. Pray that God would help shape this community as God wants. Pray that God helps me be the leader God needs and uses in this place.

Pray believing. Pray trusting. Pray ready to act on God's leading.

See You at the PoleTM 2006: Be Still and Know

Morning of September 27, 2006

In a world full of chaos and endless activity, God is calling for us to slow down and listen to Him. Intent on making their lives count, millions of teenagers will pause to do that at **See You at the PoleTM** (SYATP) this September.

"Be STILL and KNOW that I am GOD" is the theme for See You at the Pole this year, with the event scheduled for Wednesday, September 27.

See You at the Pole is a student-initiated and student-led movement that started in the Ft. Worth suburb of Burleson, Texas, in 1990. It originated with just one youth group, who met at night at several schools around Burleson during a weekend retreat. SYATP brings students to their school flagpoles to intercede for their leaders, schools, and families, asking God to bring moral and spiritual awakening to their campuses and countries. Last year, over 5 million youth participated in the quiet time of prayer at the flagpole. Participants don't have to pay anything to participate in See You at the Pole.
