GUIDANCE

"When I meditated on the word Guidance, I kept seeing "dance" at the end of the word. I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing.

When two people try to lead, nothing feels right. The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky.

When one person realizes that, and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music.

One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another.

It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully. The dance takes surrender, willingness, and attentiveness from one person and gentle guidance and skill from the other.

My eyes drew back to the word Guidance. When I saw "G" I thought of God, followed by "u" and "i". "God," "u" and "i" dance." God, you and I dance.

As I lowered my head, I became willing to trust that I would get guidance about my life. Once again, I became willing to let God lead.

My prayer for you today is that God's blessings and mercies be upon you on this day and everyday.

May you abide in God as God abides in you.

Too Much

"Let not any iniquity have dominion over me."

Psalm 119:133b (NAS)

"I have been pondering the phrase from Psalm 119 that says." Let not any iniquity have dominion over me." No sin (iniquity) is good to have in our lives. I sometimes find it hard to confess my specific sin to God even though I want a personal relationship with Him and my sin clogs the communication. I would rather just say "Forgive me, Lord, for the bad I do." and be done with that part of my prayer so I can get on with the "asking" part. Selfish!

I have a girlfriend and her husband who had an argument with their teen daughter. They required the teen to write an apology note to them before she got off of restriction. The teen simply complied with the her parents direction by writing something like, "I'm sorry for what I did. Please forgive me. I love you." My friend didn't accept the apology note as it was written because, while her daughter had said she was sorry, she didn't take the time to really think about what she had done and learn from her iniquity. The lesson here is that there is merit in thinking about how you were tempted, what you did, what the consequences of your sin brought, and saying to God (an each other) what it is <u>exactly</u> that you are sorry for.

As I thought about not wanting iniquity to have dominion over me, I thought about the obvious sins I needed to confess. Those were actually easy to list because they were such glaring examples of disobedience. The ones I had a harder time admitting to and confessing are the sins I would call the "too much" sins. We all have "too much" sins in our lives. What is a "too much" sin?

Usually I think of the word "*much*" in a good light. *Much* is mostly used as a measurement. "*Much*" sounds like abundance as in, "There was much rejoicing" or "God has given me so much." The dictionary defines the word *much* like this: "great in quantity, measure or degree."

If I put the word, "too" before the word "much," I head in to the negative. The list of habits and hobbies that follow the words, "too much" are endless. A little of any of these things isn't necessarily a sin. It becomes a sin when we do it too much as in, "Too much food to eat" becomes gluttony," "Too much television or computer time becomes laziness" or "Too much liquor" becomes alcoholism." "Too much money" can be greed. "Too much" of anything becomes an addiction/ obsession and means that somehow I am out of balance with God's plan for my life. Being out of balance with God's plan and purpose usually means we also miss a special blessing of peace and stress-free living that God wanted to give us. Our lives today are so full of stressful living. Could it be that we would live a more quiet, purposeful life for God if we avoided the sin of "too much?" **Yes!**

So as you take stock this week in your walk with God, what things in your life fall under the category of "too much.?" It can be anything that is good or pleasurable but that is done to excess. Is there a sin of "too much" that needs to be confessed in your life? Philippians 4:5 says, "*Let your* <u>moderation be known to man.</u>" Let's ask God to direct us to guide us to watch out for anything in our lives that might be "too much."
